**Extension of DESE Mask Requirement**

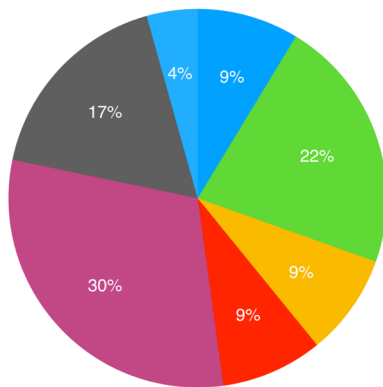
